Dear Constituents, did you know?

Our government's plan to fight Covid-19 and invest in Canadian jobs and businesses has helped recover nearly 80% of the jobs lost at the start of this crisis. However, many Canadians continue to face unemployment or reduced hours due to public health restrictions and recent lockdown measures to control the spread of COVID-19. - Transitioned workers to a more flexible Employment Insurance program

- Created three new benefits for workers who do not qualify for EI:

 2. The Canada Recovery Caregiving Benefit (**CRCB**)
 3. The Canada Recovery Sickness Benefit (**CRSB**)

- Increased the maximum Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (**CEWS**) rate to 75%
- Expanded the Canada Emergency Business Account (**CEBA**)




