



LEARN A RHYME, MAKE A TOY, PLAY OUTSIDE

As we were checking our bird feeder during the winter storm these last few days, we noticed that something was going on. We could not fill it fast enough and it seemed always empty. So we started to pay attention to understand what was happening. Now, our black-capped chickadees fly by as usual, and a downy woodpecker can be seen hanging on

the feeder early in the morning. Some blue jays usually spot the commotion before mid-day and come to help themselves. A few dark-eyed juncos and tree sparrows also come to visit now and then. A family of crows come around to check what is happening from the field behind the house. The Firemen's rock pigeons from across the street make their rounds and have the chief bird cling to the feeder while making seeds fall to the ground. And then there are the field mice who dash back and forth on top of the snow picking up the pieces left behind, plunging into their icy tunnels. The local cat sneaks by in the late afternoon trying to catch a meal (we have seen scattered bird feathers on many occasions). Even racoons left their muddy paw prints all over the feeder a while ago. And we are told that deer can try a few licks if they are hungry enough. Amazing activity for such a small bird feeder!

Bird watching is very entertaining for adults as well as for young children. Setting up a comfortable chair by a nice window and placing the feeder in its view can account for many pleasant hours in a day. And then going outside to identify tracks in the snow around the feeder can be very instructive. Can you see the difference between the tracks of a deer mouse and meadow vole or those of a rabbit and of a hare? Hunting for tracks in the snow can keep young children very busy. Recording their findings in a special notebook will keep them coming back to add to their collection.

Ever wonder where birds hide during a winter storm? They use cavities in the trees, old bird houses and find entries into barns. They can also huddle together in cedar trees. Making bird houses during the winter months from scrap wood and having children decorate them with natural elements like beach wood, shells, birch bark and small fir or pine branches can be very interesting. It is better not use paints and glues because birds will not use the shelters. Going outside with children to find the perfect spot to set them up can fill an afternoon with good winter fun. They can then make up stories about winter storms, shivering birds and warm shelters. As Lucy Maud Montgomery once wrote: Winter will pass, and once more in the spring, the violets will bloom, and robins will sing.
