LEARN A RHYME, MAKE A TOY, PLAY OUTSIDE



Reading our own Henry Houghton's "The Secret of the Meow Meow Temple" (2022) (and Alison's, of course), one has to be carried away by his playful words: "You said you wanted an adventure, Winnie looked at Dex. THIS is our adventure!" Like an echo from the past, it brings back souvenirs from our own childhoods and all those adventures by the river, in the woods,

over the hills, on small trails and into darkness. Following an impulse or a desire, an intrigue filled with excitement, fear, and expectation (nothing in the world was more fun) filled our summer afternoons with so many stories. Scary monsters, wonderful fairies and awful goblins haunted our dreamy nights and made us jump out of bed in the morning ready for another day.

The Doaktown community garden is ready for planting. Raised boxes are available as well as a freshly plowed huge garden patch. And this is OUR adventure! An invitation to save growing vegetables and to protect budding flowers. Nightly beasts are prowling nibling on our seedlings and small creatures are hiding beneath the leaves, squashing our plants. Footprints in the morning are found crisscrossing the garden and need to be investigated. All hands are needed to fight to protect our produce. Our mission: to fill our pantries and stack our shelves with fresh and canned vegetables and fruits, and to adorn our tables with fresh summer flowers. Are you with us? Come and share the work with us and the wealth with our seniors!

We have earth. We have compost. And we have all manner of seeds and plants. Bring your grandchildren. Bring your friends. If you are a teacher, bring your students. If you are an early childhood educator, bring your little ones. Make it a weekly activity. Come and meet people and perhaps, if you are lucky, raising your eyes from weeding, looking at the end of the field, you might spot the elusive ghost of New Brunswick staring from afar or even Doaktown's wood fairies with their short black hair and red neckties, swirling their tiny black swords with lightning speed, fighting each other for the heart of a flower or another. Come and share the magic of summer's fresh air, the scent of wildflowers and the joy of growing tomatoes and cucumbers.





Check with your local municipal office to see if a community garden is available in your area. If not, come and see the one we have in Doaktown just behind the Doak Provincial Heritage Site. Take the time to visit the Doak House and its schoolhouse! If you would like to do gardening, we will share our knowledge and experiences. All you really need is a handful of seeds, a shovel, a patch of earth and a hat. Don't forget your bug repellent! Come and join the adventure! We will be waiting.
