Father's Day Facts

- Average age of a first time father is 30
- 29 million fathers in the nation are grandfathers
- First Father's day was celebrated on June 19, 1910
- Estimated to be 79 million fathers across the nation
- About 66% of fathers who had their first child between 2016-2020 took leave compared with 14% of fathers who had their first child in 1980 or earlier
- Oldest confirmed father was 92 years old

First to be Trained in Canada

Volunteer firefighters from the Village of Doaktown and Blackville have made provincial history as the first group to complete the newly redesigned Medical First Responders (MFR) pilot program curriculum from St. John Ambulance Canada.

The intensive 40-hour program, which was completed over four 10-hour days at the Doaktown Municipal Office, provides advanced training beyond standard first aid. This specialized curriculum focuses on advanced patient assessment, oxygen administration, and trauma care, ensuring that these community responders are better equipped to provide critical, life-saving interventions before an ambulance arrives.

Our volunteers continue to put in significant time to ensure the safety of our communities. The successful pilot of this curriculum marks a significant step in enhancing rural emergency medical response across the region.

The graduating group included:

Doaktown Fire Department: Chief Tim Lambert, Deputy Chief Peter Arbeau, Captain Jonathan Storey, and firefighters, Shawn Anthony Storey and Liam Geisbrecht. Absent: Trevor Price.

Blackville Fire Department: Firefighters, Bradley Brophy and Trevor Underhill.

Community Partners: Health care worker, Nicole Robichaud Munn.

The training was led by St. John Ambulance trainer, Brenda Munn and medical first responder instructor, Ken Leavitt.

This milestone was celebrated with a meet-and-greet on April 25 at the Doaktown Municipal Office.

Mental Health Awareness

I have struggled with writing this article on Mental Health, trying and stopping to get it “just right” and to share with you how impactful all our thoughts can be. I wanted to write it and have it be beautiful, to bring it to you like flowers from a garden, but I was reminded that flowers are the most beautiful when they are allowed to continue to bloom where they are planted, not just when they are picked from the garden.

The topic of mental health can bring up a lot of feelings in people, often the biggest being fear, and we don't tend to like that feeling. We want to shy away, so we push it down and keep moving on as best we can. But life is funny and has a way of bringing us to the doorstep of a place that we don't always want to be, don't always know or understand and all a sudden the things that once felt safe can feel uncertain and unsafe.

At its heart, mental health is about the quality of our lives. It is about how we carry the world within us – how we process sorrow and joy, uncertainty and hope, and how we choose to spend the days we have been given. I often tell clients that tending to the mind is like cleaning out an old closet or garage. You pull everything into the light and look at it honestly. Some things you realize you no longer need, and you wonder why you carried them for so long. Other things are precious, meaningful pieces of yourself that had been forgotten beneath the dust of time. Even more, some things have been given to us by others and we're just not sure what to do with them. We just know that they're taking up some much-needed space.

The work of sorting through it all – holding each memory, each hurt, each hope in your hands and deciding whether to keep it or let it go – can be exhausting. But it is the kind of exhaustion that follows meaningful labor, like the ache after a long day spent building something worthwhile. Your mental health matters. There is grace in caring for it, and courage in allowing yourself to be cared for too.

We cannot hold joy without also making room for sorrow; they belong to one another, like opposite sides of the same coin. We are now entering a season of light, with winter's long darkness having loosened its grip. In every season, life will offer us both beautiful days and difficult ones – ones that fill us with laughter, and others that quietly shape our strength, wisdom, and compassion. Together, they come to be the story of who we are becoming.

May you remember that while it is possible to build a house or plant a garden alone, such work becomes lighter when shared with others. None of us were meant to carry every burden alone and there is help available to you.

FAQs

Am I required to help the individual get in and out of the car, or assist with groceries or parcels?

The volunteer driver is not required to carry, lift, or provide special assistance that could harm him/her.

Will all participants be given a set of rules/guidelines?

Yes, all clients are required to sign a Client Agreement before taking part in the program.

How quickly is mileage reimbursed, and does it follow the Provincial Rate? What documentation is needed?

Typically, mileage is reimbursed on a monthly basis at a rate of 57 cents per kilometre. The volunteer driver will use the Mileage Claim Form for reimbursement. Reimbursement is also non taxable to the driver.

Do I need to wait during the passenger's appointment?

Most appointments are short (less than 4 hours) and we ask volunteer drivers to please wait for the client. For longer appointments (4 hours +) the driver can leave the client and return to pick up the client at the end of the appointment.

Do I need to keep records of rides or mileage, and how should they be submitted?

Urban/Rural Rides provide volunteer drivers with a Mileage Claim Form to use. They are to be submitted monthly to the ride coordinator either by email, text or regular mail.

Are there specific requirements or background checks?

- Urban/Rural Rides requests that all volunteer drivers have automobile insurance including third party liability of \$2M. Urban/Rural Rides will reimburse up to \$80 annually for increasing the third party liability insurance to \$2M.
- A criminal background check and vulnerable sector check .
- All drivers must provide a driver's abstract and be at least 21 years of age
- A Social Development record check form is provided by Urban/Rural Rides during the registration process.
- Vehicles must be up to date on vehicle inspection and registration (proof of inspection and registration is required).

Are safety measures or support available if assistance is needed during a ride?

Volunteer drivers are supported by their ride coordinator. If there are any issues, the volunteer driver should call the ride coordinator, who will advise on next steps.

Do I need special, or more expensive insurance?

We request that all volunteer drivers have automobile insurance including third party liability of \$2M. Urban/Rural Rides will reimburse up to \$80 annually for increasing the third party liability insurance to \$2M.

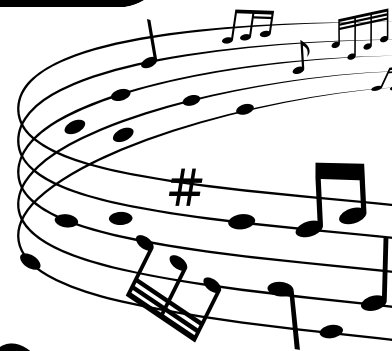

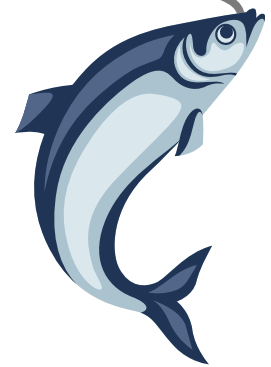
